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## The American Musical Instrument Society Organization, 1972–2021

On the following pages, tables list the elected officers and governors of the Society, organized under the twelve presidencies to date. Also included are publication editors and managers, as well as other appointed officers. The joint and sustained labors of these individuals have shaped the Society over its fifty years of existence.

For elected officers and governors, the term of office begins with the mid-year annual meeting. The term of the founding president, Robert M. Rosenbaum, ended in mid-year 1977, for example, whereupon his successor, Frederick R. Selch, took office. When no term dates follow a name in these tables, the term coincides with that of the president. In contrast, the terms of editors and managers of publications roughly match the years in which those publications appeared. Mid-year changes of editors of the Newsletter are not indicated here, but are announced in individual issues archived online: https://www.amis.org/newsletter-archive.

Governors and other members serve on various committees, which handle the continuing business of the society. Among the most consequential is the Nominating committee, which nominates several new governors per year, a new president and vice-president every few years, and other officers (secretary, treasurer, registrar, editors, and managers) at suitable intervals. The Local Arrangements and Program committees produce the Society's annual meetings. For each of the awards and prizes described in later pages of this volume, a separate committee receives nominations and evaluates relevant information before presenting a recommendation to the board of governors for approval.

Other long-term committees are concerned with issues of membership, archives, electronic initiatives, and special publications. Ad hoc committees and working groups are appointed on occasion to deal with newly arising issues and opportunities. Upon appointment, members of the respective committees are named in the newsletter, in the issue following the

Another essential team of members forms the Editorial Board, which assists the Journal editors in evaluating submissions and other editorial business. The board members, who are chosen to represent a breadth and depth of organological knowledge, are listed on the second page of each issue of the journal.

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
